LCF Research, a New Mexico nonprofit organization with a community board, d/b/a NM Health Information Collaborative (NMHIC), provides a Statewide Health Information Exchange (HIE), powered by Orion Health, allowing healthcare professionals quick access to patient history, to improve the quality, safety and efficiency of healthcare delivery across the state.

NMHIC HIE receives data from 58% of New Mexico hospital beds and 73% of all emergency department admissions. Current participants include several hospitals, provider groups, NM Medicaid and commercial payer organizations, three laboratories, one statewide diagnostic imaging organization, a pharmacy, a professional healthcare association representing Federally Qualified Health Clinics (FQHCs) and public health.

We welcome additional stakeholders, i.e., health, hospice, skilled nursing facilities, behavioral health, employers, school-based clinics, and ancillary service providers.

The use of HIE holds much potential for rural New Mexico. Rural health care providers and patients often face obstacles different from those experienced in urban areas—including geographical, cultural, and economic factors—that impacts how providers deliver care and how patients receive it. NMHIC will continue to assess the health IT needs in rural NM and work on gathering additional data from area hospitals.

NMHIC has started work with organizations in bordering states to share information across our borders to support patient referral patterns. We started direct trust exchanges with Colorado through CORHIO and are in discussions with exchange for the Lubbock and El Paso areas. In addition, we have been working on connection to the National HIE (eHealthExchange).

HIEs have been shown to save lives, avoid complications, and deliver optimal quality care by

- avoiding duplicative testing, imaging and treatment
- preventing unnecessary readmissions to the hospital
- reducing adverse drug events
- reducing length and complexity of hospitalization
- reduced costs associated with traditional medical records processes
- improvement in the patient experience
- providing emergency department and hospital admission notifications and other analytics for providers as well as managed care organizations.
- Helping payers and their care managers to interceded early using risk assessments obtained from data in the HIE.

This is a powerful clinical tool that is improving the quality and safety of care every day in New Mexico; however, ***in order to maximize benefit, all of the providers and hospitals in New Mexico should participate.***
